Remembrance

This time of year is a very difficult time of year for many. The changing seasons with diminishing daylight hours possess a challenge for those affected by seasonal disorder. We also have the festivities of Bonfire Night, which is rooted in the story of Guy Fawkes and the gun powder plot. In modern times the mask of Guy Fawkes has been popularised by the film V for Vendetta. It has become associated with those disaffected by society and the people who govern us. All these tensions build up and affect people in different ways. For me, Remembrance is a difficult time because it affects me personally. Years ago, though it doesn't seem so, I lost a brother in the Iraq War. Remembrance for many is a time they would rather not remember, including myself, but we must if we are to learn anything. Having said that, we don't seem to have learned much. The world is still a place of disorder and chaos, glistening with glimmers of light and beauty.

I feel for all those who are still caught in the midst of War, those who know the true cost of it and the madness that it creates. I think of those poor souls in the trenches on the front line in Ukraine, who are fighting for the right to be free from the possessive arms of a Russian state that see it's populace as nothing more than worthless slaves. A state that murders people with an ease of consciousness that is worse than merely depraved. In the Gospel of John, he writes: 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it' (Jn. 1:5). British Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey, on the eve of the first World War uttered the words, 'The lamps are going out all over Europe, we shall not see them lit again in our life-time'.

Yet, despite tragedy and the Remembrance of them, we have, I believe a great hope, which is not dependent upon us but upon Christ. As a man of faith, I hope in him not in ourselves, ultimately. Though, we do have our part to play. Let this time be for us, a time of reflection and renewed action. To commit ourselves to the service of God and the values we treasure and give thanks for those who have. Those whose lives have given us cause to champion and a freedom to celebrate.

IT'S ONLY NATURAL

We naturally think of human nature as something distinct from, or superior to, the rest of the animal kingdom. On the other hand, if there really is such a thing as human nature, a nature which all humans share, then this in itself is nothing special: any member of a species, by definition, shares its nature with all the other members. Furthermore, what comes to us naturally is pretty much the same as what comes naturally to a vast range of other creaturely forms of life. It's only natural, for example, to love our offspring, and for me to love my family more than yours. It's also natural, though not always easy, to feel at home in the place of our birth and therefore wish to defend it. There is a sense indeed in which everything we do and think is a product of one natural evolutionary process. None of this, of course, is to suggest that we are merely part of the animal kingdom. On the contrary, as human beings we have rational choices to make, moral choices in particular. Hence the inbuilt tension within our conceptual distinction between man-made or artificial on the one hand, and whatever is natural on the other. We nevertheless need the distinction, not just to mark the difference between our world and anything we might want to regard as supernatural, but to distinguish human creation and destruction from the behaviour of the animal kingdom and the mindless goings on of the world at large. But whilst the natural world can be indiscriminately violent or vicious, we accuse neither stones nor animals of being immoral or evil. If we insist on distinguishing ourselves (Homo sapiens, the wise ones) from the rest of nature, then this is largely because we alone have developed a form of language which enables us to conceptualize ethical principles. That it's only natural is often put forward, nevertheless, as though it were an ethical free pass, a kind of readymade justification for our behaviour. Being naturally territorial creatures, it's only natural to get angry if someone tries to force their way into the home. By extension, it's natural to be angry when illegal immigrants take advantage of our hospitality. And the more personally disadvantaged someone might be as a result, the more understandable their anger. But whilst patriotism as such might be all well and good, it ceases to serve when used as a refuge from which to hide our distinctively human moral failings. The ethical challenge, as always, is to recognize the better side of our human nature and endeavour to act accordingly. One challenge in particular for our flag waving society today is to recognize the danger of progressing from that natural form of display we call patriotism, through to jingoism, only to end up with that all too human form of irrational hatred -- xenophobia.

The Delightful Apple Tree

Did you know that before the war, there were over fifty types of apple readily available for the consumer to buy? Yet look in any shop now to see that today we have only a tiny number of commercial varieties to choose from. The commercial world needs heavy crops, large, regular shaped fruit, resistance to bruising, storage for many months and visual attractiveness. Flavour is not the top priority.

For the gardener who values flavour, the solution is to get a much tastier apple by growing your own. This will certainly involve a quest discovering less commercial alternatives to the ubiquitous Cox's Orange, Bramley or Golden Delicious - but the result will be well worthwhile.

First decide what you want your apple to do for you: for instance, no diseases to need spraying? Try the cooker 'Bardsey' or dessert 'Red Windsor'.

Dual purpose cooker and eater? Try the tasty 'Cobra'.

A truly delicious traditional eating apple? Try 'Chivers Delight' 'Rosemary Russet' or 'Pitmaston Pineapple'.

Local heritage? You won't get more local than the cooking apple 'Tillington Court'.

Apples make superb garden trees because an apple tree's height and vigour is controlled by the rootstock it is propagated onto. This means that you can grow the same variety in a size to suit your space. The smallest will be a 6 ft (1.8m) tree on an M 27 very dwarf rootstock, which will need a good soil and permanent staking. With more space, you can grow the same apple in a larger tree size on a more vigorous rootstock like M.26 about 15 feet/4.5m or MM. 109 about 20 feet/6m. There are also larger growing options.

The widest range of apple trees (bare root or container grown) is available to buy this month. For really helpful advice, I recommend talking to the apple tree experts at Frank P. Matthews' 'Tree Shop' retail outlet on their nursery at Tenbury Wells and also check their catalogue information. (See (www.frankpmatthews.com then 'Tree Shop').

Here's a pre-wassail toast to REAL apples!



Join almost 4,000 people in legal claim over impacts of river pollution

Thousands of people have joined a legal claim over negative impacts they have suffered as a result of river pollution.

The claim includes people living in regions near the rivers Wye, Lugg and Usk, who say they have experienced negative effects on their business and/or personal lives due to the deteriorating state of the rivers.

If you feel you have also been impacted, you may be able to join the claim.

Who can join?

The claim is open to people in the region who say they have been impacted by river pollution in a number of ways.

The rivers have historically been popular locations for a variety of riverside hobbies including wild swimming, fishing and canoeing, which residents say have now been disrupted.

Others in the region say they have been impacted financially. These include those with properties near the river which have reduced in value, and people affected by a building ban (moratorium) on properties near the River Lugg – in place due to high nutrient levels in the ground.

It is also argued that businesses such as fisheries, hotels, pubs and car parks have suffered financial setbacks as a result of the river's deteriorated state.

People experiencing these kinds of negative effects can contact Leigh Day to see if they are eligible to join the claim.

Who is the claim against?

The claim is being brought against the Avara Foods poultry group and Dŵr Cymru Welsh Water.

Avara Foods poultry group manages a majority of the largescale poultry operations in the River Wye region. It is alleged that chicken manure from these operations, which is high in phosphorus, leaches into the river causing algal blooms, which damages the state of the river.

Dŵr Cymru Welsh Water manages sewage for the entire region, and it is alleged that sewage spills have also harmed the condition of rivers across the region.
