#### **Human and Divine**

The classic definition of theology is, 'faith seeking understanding'. In other words, trying to seek a correct understanding of faith. I have 3 degrees in theology, BA, MA and a PhD. My research is in historical theology, from the 1st century to the 7th, and I have always thought that the key to a correct understanding lies in understanding the context. In my career, I loathe books that claim sensational things about Christianity that the academic community knows is total codswallop but the average Joe doesn't. I then have to spend time counteracting claims that those I encounter are convinced that I am hiding something that some foolish author has made up. The classic example was The Da Vinci Code by Dan Brown (no relative of mine!). Christianity has two main problems in the modern world. 1). That its historical claims are accurate. 2). That its theology is coherent. As a Historical Theologian, to both, I can say yes, and here's why.

We know that Jesus of Nazareth was a real person, who was born while Caesar Augustus was alive at the same time Herod the Great was. This puts his birth around 4–6 BC. We know that he was a 'tekton', which is confusingly translated as a 'Carpenter'. Jesus did not make furniture and I think the more accurate description would be that of a general builder. He made houses. We know that he died around AD 30 and was crucified under the Judean Governor Pontius Pilatus, whose name is inscribed in stone in what is referred to as the Pilate Stone, 'S TIBERIÉVM PONTIVS PILATVS PRAEFECTVS IVDAEAE'. It is incomplete but would say something like, '.... Caesar Tiberius, Pontius Pilate, Prefect of Judea'. So there are things we are certain about which very, very few scholars dispute regardless of faith, many of which I know. That Jesus was born, lived and died on a cross.

Christians believe something more. In terms of history, the accounts we have of Jesus are written by those either close to him or those who did. St Paul for example, knew Jesus' family and his disciples. A pretty close proximity to the man. Historically, this is quite unusual, that we have such close proximity to the events and the man. So why does this matter? Because not only does he have a personal experience of Jesus the Messiah, but he also knew those closest to him. The New Testament is all about seeking to understand the man they knew which is more than what we can know today. Nevertheless, at this time of year, both things overlap quite well. Jesus is born but some notice that he is unique, the shepherds and the wise men.

As we approach Christmas this year, not expecting much more than we usually see. Perhaps we may glimpse something different about Jesus, in song, scripture or poetry, or wonderment at the meaning of life and ask, as Sir John Betjeman wrote: 'Can with this single truth compare - that God was man in Palestine and lives today in bread and wine.' - Phill

# **PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES**



The Parish Council met on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> November. There were twelve councillors present and eleven members of the public. Our Herefordshire Council Ward Councillor, Mrs Pauline Crocket was in attendance. The Parish Council's Clerk, Mrs Paulette Scholes ensures that the meeting is conducted effectively and in accordance with the various governance requirements expected of a public body.

After welcoming those present and receiving apologies, we always start with a public participation session.

We firstly get an update from Cllr Crockett about Herefordshire Council's activities that might affect the Parish. These included an update on next year's Council Tax, the new green waste service which starts next April and the traffic management scheme by the school, which should be finally completed later this month.

We then open the floor to local residents who can raise issues of interest or concern. We always listen carefully to these and do our best to respond. It is often the case that resolution sits outside of the Parish Council. In these cases, we do our best to raise the issue with the appropriate organisation. Issues raised included inappropriate parking at Redstone.

We discussed a Planning Application. These are always determined by Herefordshire Council but we are consulted and respond reflecting local views. Herefordshire Council doesn't always agree with our views but we do influence the decisions made. Our responses are always recorded in our minutes which are available as a draft on the Parish Council's website as soon as possible after a meeting.

We discussed whether the Parish Council should commission and take responsibility for a crossing over the ditch at Tillington Common. As with many decisions there were pros and cons to such an arrangement, and the Parish Council had to balance these. Ultimately, the Parish Council must ensure public safety and on this basis we agreed not to the pursue the matter at this time.

Ultimately, the Parish Council must ensure public safety and on this basis we agreed not to the pursue the matter at this time.

The Parish Council has received some flooding equipment, mostly flood-bags which are inflatable 'sand-bags' which expand on contact with water. However, there are not enough for all potentially affected properties. The Parish Council will consider the matter at its next meeting. One option is for the Parish Council to purchase equipment and make this available to local residents at a subsidised rate. If you might be interested in such an arrangement please let our Clerk know.

The Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council (PCC) have been working together to ensure that a high-quality Community Magazine continues to be delivered to residents of the parish. This is a fantastic community asset and we thank the PCC and Amy, the new editor for their help and support.

Every year, the Parish Council makes a number of grants to local community organisations to support their good work, in total grants of £5,900 were agreed for next year.

The Parish Council also has to set the 'precept' for next year. This is the local 'tax' which funds the Parish Council's budget. We always try to keep any increase as low as possible. For the year starting April 2026, we agreed not to increase the precept at all. It will be the same as this year. Thanks to good financial management, we have been able to do this previously and over the last five years have one of the lowest average increases of any Parish Council in Herefordshire.

Our next meeting is 13th January, 2026, 7.00pm. Please do come along and observe or make a contribution. We currently have two vacancies, if you are interested in joining us and helping to make a difference locally, then please do contact our Clerk (details on our website).



January meetings are on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>






